**Information for any of our families considering the possibility of an education at Lakeside Lutheran:** The state of Wisconsin provides the **Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP)** to eligible students in parochial and non-public schools. The major change in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) this year is that the income levels were raised. In fact, the state budget raised those cap levels by about 18%! The figure that the state uses as the measure of eligibility for the WPCP is the Adjusted Gross Income (AGI). The AGI is found on line 37 of the 1040 long form and line 21 of the 1040 short form. The application period for the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) begins February 1 and ends April 20. Families typically apply for the WPCP as the student enters grade 9 at Lakeside. However, transfer students from public high schools are also eligible. In its 107 seats for 2018-2019, Lakeside did include extra seats for transfer students who will enter Grades 10, 11, or 12. The **Luther Prep** Governing Board has approved participation by LPS in the **Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP)**. Eligibility is determined by a family's annual income. Room and board costs remain the responsibility of the parents.
